

COVID-19 Health Equity Interactive Dashboard: Interactive map containing county- and state-level data on COVID-19 cases and deaths in the U.S. Illustrates relationships between COVID-19 outcomes and various social determinants of health, such as population density, poverty, underlying health conditions, urban/rural status, and more. In The News:

July 15, 2020 — Rural America's Daily Rate of New Infections Climbs 150% in Last Month: Analysis finds the number of new COVID-19 cases reported each day in rural counties has more than doubled in the last month. Rural counties with the highest rates of new infections tend to have a state or federal prison driving the increase in infections. Other rural counties with high infection rates tend to have large proportions of African American, American Indian, or Hispanic/Latino residents. Jul 10, 2020 -- HHS Announces Over \$4 Billion in Additional Relief Payments to Healthcare Providers Impacted by the Coronavirus Pandemic: The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) announced \$3 billion in funding to hospitals serving a large percentage of vulnerable populations and \$1 billion to specialty rural hospitals, urban hospitals with certain rural Medicare designations, and hospitals in small metropolitan areas. The funding aims to provide support to those serving large rural populations facing financial devastation from the COVID-19 pandemic. <u>COVID-19 Tribal Telehealth Mini-grant</u>: Grants for tribes and tribal organizations to strengthen their local COVID-19 response by building capacity for the delivery of telehealth services and fulfill immediate Tribal telehealth needs.

<u>Emergency Funding to Support Meal Programs</u>: Grants to local park and recreation agencies to sustain summer meal programs whose operations have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
